November Start's Our Season



Shrimp Puffs for your Holiday Parties!

Total Time: 25 min

Prep: 15 min Cook: 10 min Yield: 36 puffs Level: Easy



Ingredients:

Cooking spray, for coating the muffin tin.

- 3 8 ounce cans of refrigerator crescent rolls.
- 3 cups shredded Monterey Jack Cheese.
- 1/4 cup finely chopped Sweet Onion.
- 1 cup mayonnaise.
- 1 pound 40 to 50 count shrimp, cooked and peeled, tails removed.
- ----Alternate shrimp method. 1 pound of shrimp, (Any size) chop them into small pieces and mix them in with the rest of the contents to make a uniform shrimp stuffing for the puffs.
 - 1 teaspoon chopped fresh Dill

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Coat a 12 hole cupcake pan with Olive Oil cooking spray.

Roll out the Crescent rolls in a flat sheet, and cut into 12 equal squares, press a square into the bottom of each hole, and stretch it up the sides to mostly cover the bottom & sides.

In a medium-size bowl, mix the cheese, onion, mayonnaise, shrimp and dill. Place 1 tablespoon of the shrimp and mixture on top of each biscuit. Bake for 10 minutes, or until the puffs are golden.

ONCE AGAIN LETS TALK SAFETY!

This is NOVEMBER already, winter and our waters are cooling down, not to mention the air and wind. Just what does that mean for our safety? Well the first thing that comes to my mind is Hypothermia.

What?! Hypothermia here in Florida? It can be 75 to 80 out there, not a thing to worry about, RIGHT? WRONG!!!

Hypothermia can pose a problem for boaters anytime of the year, but should be of greater concern to all Captains as we approach colder weather.

Hypothermia occurs when the body loses heat faster than it can produce it.

Hypothermia occurs most rapidly when your body is immersed in water but may occur at anytime especially in windy situations if your clothing is wet. In water at 50 degrees, the predicted time for **survival** is 1.5 to 3 hours. It can also occur in water as warm as 80 degrees or higher if you are exposed for a long period of time. For instance, in 70 to 80 degree water, a person may become exhausted or unconscious in as little as 2 Hours.

If you end up in the water and won't be able to get back in the boat right away as it capsized or sank or you fell over and no one noticed, you want to conserve your body heat.

Don't try to swim as that will very quickly drain what body heat you have. You want to climb up on any debris you can to get as much of your body OUT of the water as you can, or curl up in a ball and float. Keep any clothing you have on as your body will warm the water close to your skin and any clothing will slow the heat exchange with the water outside of your clothing.

Now in the case you can get back in your boat, or you rescue someone that is COLD, you need to get them warmed up. Your First Aid Kit should have a couple of those Mylar Space Blankets to wrap up in. They reflect over 90% of your body heat back to you!

Here is something that I hope will open your eyes to the danger of Hypothermia.

The Fatal Scenario

When your body's core Temperature reaches:

- 96 Degrees Fahrenheit Violent shivering begins.
- 95 Degrees Fahrenheit Rational thought stops.
- 93.2 Degrees Fahrenheit Consciousness becomes clouded.
- 92 Degrees Fahrenheit Memory loss, hallucinating begins.
 - 91.4 Degrees Fahrenheit Shivering stops.
 - 90 Degrees Fahrenheit You become unconscious.
- 86 Degrees Fahrenheit Death results from heart failure.

86 Degrees Fahrenheit is the ambient temperature of a fairly hot summer day. Our water off Jacksonville is rarely that warm!

It doesn't have to be freezing out to kill you!

Fishing - What & Where

These winter months can provide some of the best fishing of the year.

November means that the bait and the fish are on the move. As I write this (18 Oct) the Inshore catches of Bull Redfish These are strictly "Catch & Release" as they are way over the Slot size. If you take a quick photo and measure them, Length and Girth you can get a close weight using the formula:

Girth in inches squared, times length in inches divided by 800 = Weight in Pounds.

G2 X L ÷ 800 = Weight in Pounds

Flounder have started. In fact I have hears that they are on fire all up and down the river. There have been some large Flatties caught recently. This should carry over into the beginning of December.

The jetties will have more and more Sheepsheads as temperatures drop and the month passes.

The party grounds are where most of the action will be. N 30.23.281/ W 81.10.479 at PG/PM, N 30.23.550 / W 81.10.269 at Nine Mile and N 30.28.959 / W 81.13.184 at MR are all places worth looking for Grouper and Snapper.

Farther offshore the Wahoo will be starting to show up in limited numbers and that will increase as we go into December and beyond.

If you are Trolling offshore, you really need to remember this.

Your Boat is a disturbance in the water! To all predator fish this means a "Feeding Frenzy"

I always lift my engine (Tilt it up.) so the my boat is plowing through the water and keep the speed to just below breaking on plane. About 10 MPH. This makes as big of a wake as I can and then I run my lures close, the inside lures about 15 yards back, just at the edge of the bubble part of the wake. The outside are another 15 yards farther back and again just outside of the bubbles. Finally the "Way Back" is just where the wake is starting to clear up, not so far back you need a different Zip code.

Remember the fish are coming to the feeding frenzy (Your Boat) and those lures are stragglers trying to get back to the school. Predator fish see them as easy pickings!

I have had fish hit my lures as I was putting them in the water, just 2 or 3 feet from the boat!


