You finally bought a BOAT!

Now what do you need to be SAFE? First you need to know the 3 things I say all boaters must have. Don't leave the ramp without these.

1 - A Tow Service, either TowBoat U.S. or Sea Tow. (Rob Vermillion a club Member is a Towboat U.S. Captain, talk to him.)

2 - Strike Hold - This is a better replacement for WD-40. Strike hold is a complete Di-Electric! It keeps water from getting to your Electronics. (I used to use Electronics cleaner and a toothbrush to clean the green corrosion from my buss board every 6 months, and spray it with WD. Strike Hold works for over a year! Great stuff developed for our Special forces.

3 - Salt Away - this is also known by Salt X, Salt Terminator and various other names. It is a total salt eater! Flush your engine with it, wash the boat, rinse your trailer. I have a couple of great stories of this saving engines, and hours of work!

Just an FYI, I consider all three of these to be Number # 2 on your must have list!

Number # 1? - How much is your life or those of the people with you worth? More than \$250 to \$300 dollars? Get a good Epirb or hand held PLB! I consider that a mandatory item! (again if your boat sinks your VHF won't do you any good under water!)

Now what else should you have? One heck of a lot of stuff. (We fishermen and women never have "Junk", it is all good stuff!

The USCG requires you to have Life Jackets that fit everyone on board. (See life jackets explained else ware in this issue.) you must have a "Throwable" life preserver. I also have a rope to attach to the throwable to pull the subject to the boat if in rough seas or

the subject to the boat if in rough seas or strong current.

I never leave the dock without a GOOD First Aid kit. Make sure you have wire cutters that will cut the biggest HOOK you have on board!

You should cary extra drain plugs, and something to plug any "Through Hull" holes you might have like a transducer or water pick-up. (Just in case that big loggerhead surfaces under you as you are 30 miles out going 35 MPH and knock your fitting right off!)

You should have a good GPS, and at <u>least</u> 1 good Compass. (Electronics can crash at the worst times. {{ Backup your "Numbers" in a notebook so you don't lose then when your GPS dies! }} a Good VHF Radio, and a Hand held one is also a good idea.)

I have a "Ditch Bag" with my PLB, Hand held VHF, and a hand held GPS unit.

I also put most of the USCG required and suggested items in it, and keep it ON DECK, so if we get dunked suddenly it is with us, not down in the cabin.

You should also have AT LEAST 2 bigger fire extinguishers on board and quickly accessible. The little one that comes with your boat is not worth much unless you use it to put out someones cigarette because the smoke is bothering you.

Some additional nice to have items are a 5' or 6' gaff, boat fenders, Anchor and at least 300' to 500' of anchor rope. Extra sunscreen, sunglasses, and a couple towels. Last but not least a 5 gal bucket! Good for storing stuff, bailing and in a pinch a toilet!

Learn to use all your stuff before you go out, and ALWAYS give your crew a "Safety / How To" tour so they can handle things if you are incapacitated.

Do you know your Life Jacket Laws?

Type - I - Offshore, over 20 Lbs of Buoyancy, will turn an unconscious person face up.

Type - II - Near Shore Minimum 15.5 Lbs Buoyancy, will turn an unconscious person face up.

Type - III - Minimum 15.5 Buoyancy, will NOT turn an unconscious person face up.

Type - IV - Minimum 16.5 Lbs Buoyancy your THROWABLE device.

Type - V - Special use device Must be used in accordance with requirements on the label.

A Type - V may be substituted for any Type I, II, or III BUT it must be worn while the vessel is underway.

Every person **age 6 and under MUST** wear a Type I, II, or III while the vessel is underway.

Personal Watercraft must wear a Type I, II, III or V life jacket, **Inflatable PDF's are PROHIBITED!**

WaterSkiers must wear a Type I, II, or III Life Jacket, **Inflatable PDF's are PROHIBITED!**

Wear these, they don't work in the cabin! At least do it



while under way, especially entering and leaving the inlets, they can get rough in seconds.

Hay Guys, the <u>SAILFISH POT PARTY</u> should be sometime this month, watch your E-mail for the announcement of date and location!



Here are some Maintenance Tips to make life easier!

Got mold or a stinky cabin?

Use WHITE VINEGAR. 2 parts Vinegar to 1 part Water to wash to remove mold and foul order.

Holding tank stink?

Use WHITE VINEGAR. 2 parts Vinegar to 1 part Water. Empty the holding tank, fill with Vinegar solution, let sit for 1 hour, empty again.

Use EASY-OFF oven cleaner to clean paint or tar or other marks form your Gel Coat.

Need to put a screw in a hard to reach place? 2 remedies here.

1 - put a dollop of grease on the screwdriver head to hold the screw, bolt, or nut.

2 - Carry a small magnet in your tool kit and place the magnet on the shaft of your screwdriver to make it magnetic to hold the parts. Good stainless steel is NOT magnetic so use remedy 1

Can't get your Strap Wrench to grip your oil filter to remove it?

Put a strip of Sand Paper in the strap wrench to remove the filter.

Checked your FUEL lines lately? Seeing some cracking?

ONLY use U.S.C.G. approved Type A1-15 SAE fuel line.

Use 'T'-Clamps for all your hose fittings. They are stronger and apply EVEN pressure.

Going to rewire or install some electronics?

Again Only use type BC-5W2 Electric wire.

Have some "Through the Hull fittings? Cary tapered wood or rubber plugs for each one you have, just in case.

Have to cut or drill a hole in your Fiberglass?

Cover the area to be drilled or cut with Masking Tape to prevent chipping or slipping while working.

Have window zippers or any zippers or snaps on your boat or tackle bag?

Use ANHYDROUS LANOLIN to coat them to prevent them from seizing.

Keep your PROP smooth for best gas milage. If you can drag a cotton ball along the edge and it catches, it is time to have it reconditioned.

You should replace your Water Pump's IMPELLER every 3 years.

Put a TWIST in your Tie-Down straps to prevent the wind from rattling them and chafing your boat.

Planning on having your boat for a long time, or trailering it for any distance over 100 yards?

USE a Transom Saver, to support your engine, NOT the engine's Flip Lock.

Finally use Bearing Buddies on your trailer wheels, and check them often. The best time to check them is when you ARRIVE at a location. If they are HOT, time to replace!
