We end the Captains meeting with a big Raffle.

The schedule for Friday is show up about 8:00 AM, the Tent Company should be setting up the big tents and we will be working on all kinds of minor details like setting up chairs, tables, moving Captains buckets from the Club House, and working hard to have everything ready by 5:30 PM when we officially open onsite Registration.

The Captains meeting is at 7:00 PM followed by the ending Raffle! Then we clean up the area so it is ready for Tournament Day.

Tournament day we have to move a lot of things and set up Hell's Kitchen (So we can fillet the fresh Sheepshead, cook it and sell meals to a big crowd of visitors to our site.

This Tournament is only possible with the help of all our members that can make it to the set up Friday, and Saturday the Tournament day! **So plan on being there!**

Tournament day we start before 6:00 AM checking out the boats, (Officially checkout starts at 6:00 AM, but we have people showing up by 4:00 AM and calling in just as early!)

Fishing begins at 7:00 AM and the Weigh-In line opens at 1:00 PM and the Fish Fry gets fired up!

Weigh-In closes at 4:00 PM SHARP! (Let everyone you know that is fishing the El Cheapo know that they MUST BE **IN LINE** at 4:00 PM SHARP! Not running up to it but standing there when we close the line with an End of Line sign!!!)

The Fish-Fry (Meal) line will close at 6:00 PM

The Awards will start being presented at approximately 6:00 PM with the Kids up First followed by the Adults.

The Big Raffle will begin immediately following the awards.

As everyone else is clearing out, we clean up and put everything away so that the Boat Ramp is ready to use Sunday when the Tent Company takes down their tents, and WE don't have to come back for a third day for clean up!







Now for us members, here is what we are doing for the next couple weeks leading up to the Tournament.

Saturday 2/23/19 is the Club Clean UP day, starting about 8:00 AM.

We do clean up of the club house and grounds and any repairs that are needed on anything around the building.

March 7, 2019 is a meeting day, BUT we show up by about 5:00 PM and set up the tables in the club house like a big winding snake, and put all the Captains Bag (Bucket) handouts and free stuff along the tables, then starting at one end we pass the buckets along, with each member putting stuff from their station in the buckets. I believe the record for all 450 Buckets, Adult and Junior Angler, is 19 minutes!

To say it is hectic is an understatement! But it is a lot of fun!

OK, here are your Team leaders for the main sections.

Hell's Kitchen = The Head Chef, Joe Esparza

This is usually long hot work, frying up all the fish and fries and serving them. The more people we have working it the easier it is. PLEASE consider working it! If we have enough people we can set up shifts so people are not stuck there all Saturday.

El Cheapo Botiquo = Mrs. super organized Patti Kalaitzis

This is our merchandise sales tent and Patti will have her crew trained and ready to go by Friday evening! Unless you are working it please don't go behind the tables as it just adds to the work they are doing!

Weighmaster = Mr. No Nonsense John Porcella

John will need a few people to help keep the line running smoothly and direct people where to go for their photo and weigh slip.

Our next tournament is the Non-Live Tournament...meaning your bait cannot be alive, it doesn't just have to be artificial baits for you folks going for Captain of the Year. If you are fishing for Inshore Captain of the Year it is an artificial only tournament. Be sure to check the rules on this one...boundary is extended on the offshore side. Both tournaments will be on March 30th and you will want to be sure to attend our meeting on March 21st when tournament director Tom Darga goes through the rules to make sure you have a good Continued page 4

THE ENEMY



Fishing First Aid

This is an important Safety article, and one that most people don't give much thought to.

While there are several things that can cause injuries to us out there, like Fish Hooks, Sharp Knives, Fish Spines, Fish Teeth, (Here off Jacksonville almost everything has lots of sharp teeth!) Slips & Falls, (3 years ago I stepped on some cast net weights, fell and broke my hip!) Allergic Reactions and even Heart Attacks. Most of us are NOT prepared with anything more than band-aids!

I am 72 years old, and have now learned through personal experience most of these hazards. (I must put in here that I am a fast learner and have ((So Far.)) never repeated any of my mistakes!)

Now my first suggestion is to get a **BIG pair of wire cutters**, and test them to make sure that you can cut the biggest hook that is on your boat! The "fishing Pliers" that everyone has or that multi-tool are way too light to cut a big hardened hook. When that little 2' shark you are trying to unhook puts one through your thumb and out the middle of your thumb nail (Not to say that ever happened to me.) you will really appreciate getting it out!

Here is a list of items you might want to carry:

Super glue - Only when you are hours from shore, it can be used to close big wounds to stem the bleeding.

Antihistamine - Benadryl For that allergic reaction.

Heavy Scissors - To cut clothing or shoes off if necessary,

Duct Tape - Lots of uses for it, use it to make a splint to stabilize an arm, ankle, or any limb. Use your boat hook, gaff handle or even a Rod to make the splint. Put it over a fish spine, wait about 30 minutes and it will usually pull it out! To make a pressure dressing with a **Cloth Diaper** (A new diaper is cleaner than your 'T' shirt and bigger than any gauze pads you might have. Aspirin - I carry the powdered type that dissolves quickly when placed under the tongue, in case of a heart attack. I also carry Tylenol for people with just a headache that are on blood thinners, and **Ibuprofen** as it is also good for most pain.

You might want to have some **Hydrogen Peroxide** in a small spray bottle for those small cuts, punctures and scrapes that are not an emergency, rather just an annoyance.

Oh, you will still want to carry that small regular First Aid kit with the usual band aids, tweezers, first aid cream etc. as that is more likely to be used on any trip than the other stuff, BUT..... It never hurts to be prepared!

Your \$50 (pre registration) \$65 at the door gets you in. You get a great Steak, all the Oysters and Chicken wings you can eat, and all the Beer, soft drinks and water you can drink.
