What's in Your Ditch Bag?



You do have a Ditch Bag don't you?

Boating accidents, they happen every week. Usually the difference between a sad ending and a happy ending is preparedness. Since you can't

always count on Lady Luck (In case you haven't noticed, you are in a predicament because she isn't with you today, she's fickle, in case you haven't heard), the best thing to do is be like a Boy Scout. Veteran captains going offshore - no matter what size boat they are in -- carry emergency "ditch bags" because they never know when the catastrophic might happen.

OK, lets get started.... Your Ditch Bag should be a container that will FLOAT, is secured closed so that if your boat overturns or goes down, it will be on the surface with you, and all of it's contents inside. When you leave the dock, it should be sitting on deck, NOT in the cabin or a locker.

I have seen everything from Ice-Chest that latched shut as ditch bags to \$300 specially made ditch bags. These soft sided insulated coolers will work quite well, just make sure it will float with a full load of your gear.

Now for what you put inside. This can vary a lot from boat or Captain to Captain.

The little Sailfish signify priority items!
You should have your required flares.
(Make sure they are not out of date.) I also carry several arial flares or rockets.

First Aid supplies.

A good waterproof sun block. Neutrogena now makes one (SPF 70) that goes on wet skin, kind of handy if you are already in the water.

You should have some rope to tie everyone together so you don't drift apart. (A group of people are easier to spot than a single person.)

Ditch Bag Continued

Your bag should have a waterproof strobe light attached to it. (Be sure to test it before every trip, and change the batteries once a year.)

A signal mirror works well in bright daylight to get attention.

Drinking Water! This is left out of most ditch bags because most people do not think of it. A single gallon of water will help keep up to 4 people from becoming dehydrated for a couple of days.

Whistles for everyone! It beats yelling 10 ways to 1. Yelling is exhausting, and uses up a lot of energy, and can not be heard for a very long distance, whistles carry for a mile or more!

At the least you should have PLB

At the least you should have PLB (Personal Locator Beacon) like a Spot. Or an EPIRB

A drift marker is nice. It is a long 20 or so foot long bright red streamer that floats out along the surface to increase your spotablity from the air.

A bright die marker also helps increase your spotablity from the air, but it does dissipate, so maybe a couple of them.

If you can afford it, a hand held VHF, and a hand held GPS unit.

I also carry several Chem-Lights or Glo Sitcks that last for at least 12 hours once you break the glass vial and activate them.

I also have attached one to each Life Vest to increase visibility for each individual and the group.

That covers the basics for your ditch bag. To put all that in your bag cost a lot of money, and if you are like me you couldn't afford to do it all at once. That is OK, but start building your bag with the items that you have or can afford. You can add the hand held VHF or GPS or a big EPIRB later as you can afford to buy them. A life is worth every dollar you spend even if it stretches your budget!

OK, you have assembled your Ditch Bag, now what?

Like I said at the start of this article your bag should be ON-Deck when you leave the dock. You should then assign a primary person and a secondary backup person to be responsible, to make sure in an emergency, it goes over with them and does not get stuck in the boat!

Strength in Numbers

It is a fact that most people that engage in Saltwater Fishing also engage in at least one other outdoor sport. Hunting, Hiking, Snowmobile riding, Hiking and even Photography to name just a few.

The American Sportfishing Association has joined with the other outdoor Recreational industry, and we got a new law passed in 2016.

The Outdoor Recreation Jobs and Economic Impact Act.

The Morris-Deal study started things and was answered by NOAA Fisheries when they created the National Saltwater Recreational Fishing Policy, and then the Center for Sportfishing Policy with their "A Vision for Marine Fisheries Management in the 21st Century" documents CHANGED the way Recreational Fishing is perceived by the Regulatory Agencies, the Department of Commerce in particular!

They established that the economic benefits of recreational fishing FAR outweigh those of the commercial-fishing sector!

In a study issued by the Boulder Colorado based Outdoor Industry Association they found that Outdoor Recreation drives \$646 BILLION in spending each year and supports 6.1 Million direct Jobs and \$80 BILLION in Federal, State and local Tax Revenue! Saltwater Sport Fishing is a major part of those figures.

Outdoor Spending FAR exceeds consumer spending in each of the other categories, including Pharmaceuticals, Motor vehicles, Gasoline, fuel, and Household Utilities!

Use this when you write your letters to the Local, State, and Federal Representatives demanding they overturn the Marine Fisheries commissions, and parts of the Maginson-Stevenson Act that NOAA is using to shut down Sport Fishing!

Quick, Easy and Tasty Fish Filets in a Pan

This recipe is for any white flesh fish. With the Pompano running, it is perfect, and I always use it for B-Liners & Black seaBass. (It will even make Tilapia ((BTW, Tilapia is NOT a Seafood, it is a freshwater farmed fish.)) taste great!)

Ingredients:

4 - 1/4 Lb or bigger Filets, skin and bones removed.

1/4 - Cup Butter

1/4 - Cup White Wine a Chardoney (Probably spelled wrong) is perfect for this.

1/2 - Teaspoon Rosemary

1/2 - Teaspoon Thyme

1/2 - Teaspoon Basil

How To:

Take the Fish out of the Refrigerator 30 minutes before cooking to allow to warm to room temperature.

Melt the butter in a large frying pan, at a medium heat. Then pour in the Wine. Add the spices, crushing them between your fingers as you add them, or grinding them finely just before adding.

Stir everything briefly, then add the filets. Cook for about 5 minutes per side, or until white and easily flaked with a fork.

Serve while still piping hot, with your favorite side dishes! Yummm!

Yea! Grouper Season opens back up!

Yes, as of May 1st, Grouper Season opens up again. Here is what you need to know for fishing the Atlantic off Jacksonville!

Gag & Black - 24" TL (Total Length) - 1 / day

Red - 20" TL - 1/day - Total of 3 Grouper / day

Black Seabass - 13" - 7/ day

Cobia - 33" FL (Fork Length) - 2 / day

Dolphin (Mahi) 20" - 10 / day

Kinqfish - 24" FL - 2 / day

Spanish Mackerel - 12" FL - 15 / day

Gray Triggerfish - 14" FL - In your 20 / Day Bag limit

B-Liners, (Vermilion Snapper) - 12" TL - 5 / day

Bluefish - 12" FL - 10 / day

Red Porqey - 14" - 3 / Day

Flounder - 12" TL - 10 / day

Greater Amberjack - 28" TL - 1 / day

Spade Fish - No size - in 20 / Day Baq Limit

Tripletail - 18" TL - 2 / day

Wahoo - No size - 2 / Day

Hogfish - 16" - 1 / Day - May 1 - Oct 31

African Pompano - 24" FL - 2 / day

Red Snapper - 20" TL - 2 / Day - FLORIDA WATERS

ONLY (Within 3 Miles of shore!)

Snappers - 10 / day aggregate

Mangrove - 10" 5 / Day

Lane - 8"

Mutton - 18" 5 / Day

Cubera - 12'

May possess no more than 2 Cubera Snapper over 30' per harvester or vessel per day, whichever is less. 30" or larger not included within the Snapper aggregate bag limit.

Check the Regs before each trip to make sure they haven't changed!



First thing I want you to do is put me as the beneficiary on your boat insurance, then DO

BoatUS Media Alert: Recreational Boaters Urged to Send Message to EPA to Stop the Summertime Sale of E15 Fuel

BoatUS: "E15 is the wrong fuel for boaters, consumers and the environment"

SPRINGFIELD, Va., April 16, 2019 – In an action that many are seeing as antienvironment, anti-consumer and a big nod to the ethanol lobby, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is moving toward permitting the sale of E15 (15% ethanol) fuels during the summer ozone season (June 1 to September 15). Currently available only in the colder months, E15's summertime ban was implemented years ago to address concerns over its contribution to ground level ozone (smog) on hot days.

The nation's largest boating advocacy, services, and safety group, Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS), wants EPA to immediately halt any expansion of the fuel's availability and is asking recreational boaters to speak up now to stop the summertime sale of E15 and offers an easy way contact the EPA by going to http://bit.ly/2UyyMFV.

Boaters have no love for ethanol in their gas because its **proven** to damage boat engines and fuel systems. If they had their choice of fuel, more than four out of five boat owners (83%) would choose E0 (ethanol-free) fuel – if it was available. Because of the harm it causes, E15 is prohibited by federal law for use in recreational boat engines and voids many marine engine warranties.

BoatUS has long had concerns over potential consumer misfueling with E15.

Most recreational boaters refuel their vessels at roadside gas stations where pumplabeling requirements are minimal. Just one small E15 orange warning label is the only protection currently in place for marine and other off-road engines. Without additional consumer education to raise awareness that there may be more E15 fuel on market, BoatUS believes the risk of misfueling will increase and, with it, instances of expensive repairs to boat engines and fuel systems.

"E15 is the wrong fuel for the boaters, consumers and the environment," said BoatUS manager of Government Affairs David Kennedy. "As recently as 2011, EPA determined it did not have authority to waive Reid Vapor Pressure rules for E15 fuel. We believe this was the correct decision and that any changes should be made by Congress, not the EPA."

The push for the summertime sale of E15 and adding more ethanol into the nation's fuel supply is a result of the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS). When it was passed in 2005, RFS assumed that America's use of gasoline would continue to grow. Since then, however, gasoline usage has not increased as forecast, which now forces more ethanol into each gallon of gas.

To keep up with the RFS mandate and avoid hitting a "blend wall" in which the volume of ethanol production exceeds consumption and infrastructure constraints, in 2010 EPA granted a waiver to allow E15 into the marketplace but limited its sales to colder months to protect air quality.




Once again the SAMFC has deigned to bestow upon us a generous Red Snapper Season! (&*!"@!**~`!!)
