Time to talk SAFETY!

There are only (2) Two things that really scare me out on the water Fire, and Lightning!



Fire - You can reduce the chance of this by keeping your boat in good condition. Replace old hoses, make sure all hose clamps are in good condition and tight. I double clamp all fuel hoses! I also discourage any smoking on my boat. With GAS on all 4 sides of us it just isn't safe!


Here is what you can fish for, and the current rules as of 5/20/19

Be sure to check for any changes every time you go out, and have a latest print out with you. Sometimes even our good local wardens can't keep up with the SAMFC changes! Here is what you need to know for fishing the Atlantic off Jacksonville!

Gag & Black - 24" TL (Total Length) - 1 / day Red - 20" TL - 1/day - Total of 3 Grouper / day Black Seabass - 13" - 7/ day Cobia - 33" FL (Fork Length) - 2 / day Dolphin (Mahi) 20" - 10 / day Kingfish - 24" FL - 2 / day Spanish Mackerel - 12" FL - 15 / day Gray Triggerfish - 14" FL - In your 20 / Day Bag limit B-Liners, (Vermilion Snapper) - 12" TL - 5 / day Bluefish - 12" FL - 10 / day Red Porgey - 14" - 3 / Day Flounder - 12" TL - 10 / day Greater Amberjack - 28" TL - 1 / day Spade Fish - No size - in 20 / Day Bag Limit Tripletail - 18" TL - 2 / day Wahoo - No size - 2 / Day Hogfish - 16" - 1 / Day - May 1 - Oct 31 African Pompano - 24" FL - 2 / day Red Snapper - 20" TL - 2 / Day - FLORIDA WATERS ONLY (Within 3 Miles of shore!) Snappers - 10 / day aggregateMangrove - 10" 5 / Day Lane - 8" Mutton - 18" 5 / Day Cubera - 12'

May possess no more than 2 Cubera Snapper over 30" per harvester or vessel per day, whichever is less. 30" or larger not included within the Snapper aqqregate bag limit.

Check the Regs before each trip to make sure they haven't changed!

Safety Continued

As of this writing there is absolutely no way we have any control over lightning, so the best thing we can do is avoid it as much as possible.

Here are some facts to pay attention to. Lightning can strike out to over 10 miles from a thunderhead. Even if you are under a clear blue sky.

Most of us usually see the flash, then hear the thunder. That is obviously because sound travels slower than light. We can use this to our advantage. When you see the flash start counting **Hippopotamuses**, Yes, Hippopotamuses, not hippo's, but their entire name!

1-Hippopotamus,

2-Hippopotamus, 3-Hippopotamus,4-Hippopotamus, 5-Hippopotamus.

That should take about 5 seconds. Why? Because for every 5 seconds between flash and thunder, the storm is about 1 mile away! Just an FYI... That is too close for me! I will even run further out to put distance between me and the storm. (As long as the storm is moving North or South and not going to be chasing me East!)

Remember, Lightning usually strikes the highest item around the area. When you

are out on the water, <u>YOU</u> may be the highest thing around for miles.

The other steps to take are to turn off ALL Electronics, (That is why we all still have Magnetic Compasses in our boats.) lower your antennas, lay all fishing rods down on the bottom of the boat, bring in or lower your outriggers, and have your passengers sit on the floor or as low as possible and do not be touching anything metal! (I knew I wanted an old fashion ships wood steering wheel for some reason.)

There is one more thing you can do when you are out there and see the thunderheads building up on shore. Get on the VHF and call Captain **BO on the Mayport Princess** (He has radar where the Majesty does not.) Try VHF channel 8 or if no contact, try channel 68. They will let you know what way to go to avoid the storms. Usually it is "Head for the Barn NOW" and that is always the best advise if

Don't do this? <u>Shame</u> on you;

You DO leave a Float Plan either on the dash of your vehicle or with someone that will call the USCG if you don't return, don't you?

Just go to <u>www.jaxfish.com</u> and in the top menu go to "Fishing Info" down to "Links" and over to "Fishing Links" to the Float Plan Link and print out a USGC generated form. It also might be a good idea to CHECK your safety gear listed under the "Safety Gear" section to make sure it is up to date and good!

Check your EPERB also while you are at it.




Loud Hailings
