Here is a great treat to make for your holiday parties, Quick, Easy, (I made them and they were GREAT!)

Shrimp Puffs

Total Time: 25 min

Prep: 15 min
Cook: 10 min
Yield: 36 puffs
Level: Easy

Ingredients:

Cooking spray, for coating the muffin tin.

3 - 8 ounce cans of refrigerator crescent rolls.

3 - cups shredded Monterey Jack Cheese.

1/4 - cup finely chopped Sweet Onion.

1 - cup mayonnaise.

1 - pound 40 to 50 count shrimp, cooked and peeled, tails removed.

pound of shrimp, (Any size) chop them into small pieces and mix them in with the rest of the contents to make a uniform shrimp stuffing for the puffs.

1 - teaspoon chopped fresh Dill

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Coat a 12 hole cupcake pan with Olive Oil cooking spray.

Roll out the Crescent rolls in a flat sheet, and cut into 12 equal squares, press a square into the bottom of each hole, and stretch it up the sides to mostly cover the bottom & sides.

In a medium-size bowl, mix the cheese, onion, mayonnaise, shrimp and dill. Place 1 tablespoon of the shrimp and mixture on top of each biscuit. Bake for 10 minutes, or until the puffs are golden brown.

Helpful Hints & Tips

Thaw fish and shellfish in milk. The milk draws out the frozen taste and provides a fresh caught flavor.

Take the Fish out of the Refrigerator 30 minutes before cooking to allow to warm to room temperature.

Try soaking fish in 1 cup vinegar / 3 cups water for 15 minutes before cooking for a sweet tender taste.


Microwave limes for 40 seconds before squeezing, you'll get twice the amount of juice.

Add I tablespoon of vinegar to the fat in which you are going to deep fry. It will keep the food from absorbing to much fat and eliminate the greasy taste.

Clams and oysters will be simple to open if washed with cold water, then placed in a plastic bag and put in the freezer for an hour.

To get rid of the "canned taste" in canned shrimp; soak them in a little sherry and 2 tablespoons of vineqar for about 15 minutes.

Add garlic immediately to a recipe if you want a light taste of garlic and at the end of the recipe if your want a stronger taste of garlic.





What's Your Vision of the Future for the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary?

BoatUS says recreational boaters and anglers need to speak up now on restoration plan

MIAMI, Oct. 22, 2019 – For the first time since its creation in 1990, the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary is giving recreational boaters and anglers the unique opportunity to help shape its future by commenting on the draft Restoration Blueprint. The plan could expand the sanctuary's boundary, update regulations, modify and establish new marine zones, and revise its nonregulatory management plan. So what do boaters want?

Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS) urges recreational boaters to speak up now to have their voices heard at upcoming public meetings held in the Sunshine State through December 10. Boaters unable to attend a meeting may also send comments online, or mail to Sarah Fangman, Sanctuary Superintendent, Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary, 33 East Quay Road, Key West, FL 33040. Comments will be accepted through January 31, 2020.

"Recreational boaters and anglers want the continued ability to recreate on these pristine waters," said BoatUS Manager of Government Affairs David Kennedy, "However, boater/ anglers are just one of many different constituent groups on the restoration plan. It's important we speak up on what we want the future to look like. Habitat threat from hurricanes, disease, rising ocean temperatures, pollution and human interactions will all be addressed." Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary Restoration Blueprint proposal public meetings will be held from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. in Coral Gables, Fort Myers and Marathon and will accept oral and written comment. Coral Gables and Fort Myers meetings also will provide information and answers to written questions.

Additionally, on December 10 a NOAA Sanctuary
Council Advisory Meeting will be held from 1 p.m. to 9
p.m. at the Islander Resort, 82100 Overseas Highway,
Islamorada. RSVP is required, and the public may
provide oral or written comment. Boaters may also
view the Sanctuary Advisory Council's live-streamed
meetings on its YouTube channel.
