Largest was a Barracuda 30.7 lbs caught by Derek and attracting flies, not sure if it was the fish or Derek attracting them. At JW we were actually able to throw chunks of cigar minnow and had the snapper eating at the back of the boat. Question can you catch a red snapper slow trolling at JW after bottom fishing? YES, Billy Bait Master Hooker purple and black with a whole Cigar Minnow with a 3oz sinker to hold it down, 20 to 25 lbs have a nice picture of it.

Well the boating season is definitely here. So in honor of it, here are some tips and tricks to help you make it a safer and easier year.

While I know you have seen some of these here before they are worth repeating.

- 1 (My favorite) NEVER approach the dock any faster than you want to RAM the dock!
- 2 Oven cleaner like "Easy-Off" will remove paint and adhesive residue from Gelcoat without damaging it.
- 3 If you are using a putty knife to scrape something, use a file to ROUND the corners so it won't gouge the surface.
- 4 Take an afternoon and check the water in your batteries to make sure they are full, and clean!
- 5 CHECK your FIRE EXTINGUISHERS! Make sure they are in good shape, and fully charged! Turn them over and shake them vigorously to make sure the powder is not hard and compressed in the bottom. Get an EXTRA bigger fire extinguisher, the one small one is legal but not enough if you actually have a fire.

What's in Your Ditch Bag? You do have a Ditch Bag don't you?



Boating accidents, they happen every week. Usually the difference between a sad ending and a happy ending is preparedness. Since you can't always count on Lady Luck (In case you haven't noticed, you are in a predicament because she isn't with you today, she's fickle, in case you haven't heard), the best thing to do is be like a Boy Scout. Veteran captains going offshore - no matter what size boat they are in -- carry emergency "ditch bags" because they never know when the catastrophic might happen.

OK, lets get started.... Your Ditch Bag should be a container that will FLOAT, is secured closed so that if your boat overturns or goes down, it will be on the surface with you, and all of it's contents inside. When you leave the dock, it should be sitting on deck, NOT in the cabin or a locker.

I have seen everything from Ice-Chest that latched shut as ditch bags to \$300 specially made ditch bags. These soft sided insulated coolers will work quite well, just make sure it will float with a full load of your qear.

Now for what you put inside. This can vary a lot from boat or Captain to Captain.

The little Sailfish signify priority items!

You should have your required flares.

(Make sure they are not out of date.) I also carry several arial flares or rockets.

First Aid supplies.

A good waterproof sun block. Neutrogena now makes one (SPF 70) that goes on wet skin, kind of handy if your already in the water.

FLOAT PLAN

With the next two offshore tournaments in May; the May Trolling Tournament and the Unlimited Trolling Tournament, all Captains should give a lot of thought to making sure the boat and equipment will perform satisfactorily and safely before heading out to the favorite spot offshore. You should, also, have a float plan to make sure that someone knows where to look for you, and what will happen, if your equipment fails while off shore.

The first thing you need to do to make sure that your outing on the water begins and ends safely is to develop a float plan and leave it with your spouse, significant other, some other reliable person, or your marina. Ask the custodian of the plan to contact the Coast Guard or other local authority if you do not return by the indicated time on the plan.

A news article that appeared in the local paper headlined "High drama, high seas" told the story of a local boater on a 35-foot Viking and how a float plan and the proper equipment on board prevented a loss of life. The boater had filed a float plan, left it with his wife and was proceeding to his destination about 30 miles offshore when a fire broke out and destroyed the boat. Fortunately, the boater had not only filed a proper float plan, but had extra safety equipment on board such as an EPIRB, life raft, ditch bag and hand held radios.

After the crew abandoned the boat, continued to send a MAYDAY message, and the EPIRB was activated, the Coast Guard contacted the boater's wife to verify certain facts. The wife advised the Coast Guard that if the EPIRB was on, the crew was in trouble. A boat that had seen the smoke came to check and advised the Coast Guard it would stand by until they arrived on scene as their boat was too small to take all the crew on board. Remember, if you have an EPIRB, make sure it is registered so there will be a contact person listed in case it is turned on in an emergency. There have been cases where an EPIRB was purchased, not registered and when activated was useless.

The following statement by this boat captain is one all of us should follow: "If I tell my wife we'll be in by 8:30, and we're not in, and she hasn't heard from me – don't start worrying, start calling the Coast Guard."

Hopefully, the above experience will remind all of us to file a float plan before we leave home for the launch ramp. The float plan should contain your name, address, phone number, name and description of your vessel, names of other persons on board, trip details including geographical location of your destination, the route you will take to get there, and/or GPS numbers if possible, time of return and time to call local authorities or Coast Guard if you do not return by the scheduled time. A properly executed float plan could be a lifesaver in an emergency if you have to abandon your vessel at sea, or break down, with no power for your radio to communicate your location and notify someone of your need for help.

The local Coast Guard station phone number is 904-564-7592. Make sure the person who has your float plan has this phone number, or put it on your float plan. A properly executed float plan would enable the person in custody of the float plan to initiate a timely search for you if you did not return by the time specified. Time could be a critical factor in saving your life in a real emergency. A sample float plan form for your use is available in the boating safety materials rack at the Mayport clubhouse.

Download a form and create your own personalized float plan, and file a plan on line with the web site for no charge.

File a float plan each time you go boating/fishing to help ensure your safety on the water. May you continue to enjoy safe boating throughout the year.

Ditch Bag Continued

You should have some rope to tie everyone together so you don't drift apart. (A group of people are easier to spot than a single person.)

Your bag should have a waterproof strobe light attached to it. (Be sure to test it before every trip, and change the batteries once a year.)

A signal mirror works well in bright daylight to get attention.

Drinking Water! This is left out of most ditch bags because most people do not think of it. A single gallon of water will help keep up to 4 people from becoming dehydrated for a couple of days.

Whistles for everyone! It beats yelling 10 ways to 1. Yelling is exhausting, and uses up a lot of energy, and can not be heard for a very long distance, whistles carry for a mile or more!

At the least you should have PLB (Personal Locator Beacon) like a Spot. Or an EPIRB

A drift marker is nice. It is a long 20 or so foot long bright red streamer that floats out along the surface to increase your spotablity from the air.

A bright die marker also helps increase your spotablity from the air, but it does dissipate, so maybe a couple of them.

If you can afford it, a hand held VHF, and a hand held GPS unit.

I also carry several Chem-Lights or Glo Sitcks that last for at least 12 hours once you break the glass vial and activate them.

I also have attached one to each Life Vest to increase visibility for each individual and the group.

That covers the basics for your ditch bag. To put all that in your bag cost a lot of money, and if you are like me you couldn't afford to do it all at once. That is OK, but start building your bag with the items that you have or can afford. You can add the hand held VHF or GPS or a big EPIRB later as you can afford to buy them. A life is worth every dollar you spend even if it stretches your budget!

OK, you have assembled your Ditch Bag, now what?

Like I said at the start of this article your bag should be ON-Deck when you leave the dock. You should then assign a primary person and a secondary backup person to be responsible, to make sure in an emergency, it goes over with them and does not get stuck in the boat!

The Greater Jacksonville Kingfish Tournament underwent a format change last year that was widely accepted by its participants. In our continuing efforts to provide the best experience for not only our anglers but also the fans that show up at the tournament and festival we sent out questionnaires for both groups to voice their opinions on the changes. By a wide margin there were positive responses. And there were ideals in several of those surveys that were taken up by our board of directors at last years' September planning session for the 2014 tournament.

Here are some of the more prominent changes: The General Tournament was changed last year to a one day format with a second day "shootout" for the top ten finishers and the Redneck VIP winner. (Eleven boats on day two) The new change eliminates that VIP winner slot, but increases the first day finishers to the top 10% of the field. Ex. 200 entries in the GT = 20 shootout qualifiers.

The Redneck VIP remains the same except for a name change to our 'Warm Up Tournament', sponsored by Summit Contracting Group. This will be a Stand Alone Tournament with it's own separate winners.

Another new addition we are proud to announce is a partnership with the Down Syndrome Association of Jacksonville for a new dock tournament, the 'Down at the Dock Fishing Derby'. 50 junior anglers with Down syndrome and their siblings will have a fish derby, held on Wed, prior to tournament week. This will be a lot of fun. That makes 3 Jr Tournaments on our schedule during tournament week. Look for more of these kind of events in the future.

Through board member Dave Workman's affiliation with world famous marine artist Guy Harvey, we were able to commission an original work from Mr Harvey to be used on our tournament tee shirts. We have it in our hands and "WOW" is it beautiful. The shirts are going to be awesome!

Yes, as of May 1st, Grouper Season opens up again. Here is what you need to know for fishing the Atlantic off Jacksonville!

Gag & Black - 24" TL (Total Length) - 1 / day Red - 20" TL - 1/day - Total of 3 Grouper / day Black Seabass - 13" - 5 / day

Cobia - 33" FL (Fork Length) - 1 / day

Dolphin (Mahi) 20" - 10 / day

Kingfish - 24" FL - 2 / day

Spanish Mackerel - 12" FL - 15 / day

Gray Triggerfish - 12" FL - No Limit

B-Liners, (Vermilion Snapper) 12" TL - 5 $\,/\,$ day

Bluefish - 12" FL - 10 / day

Flounder - 12'' TL - 10 / day

Greater Amberjack - 28" TL - 1 / day

Tripletail - 15" TL - 2 / day

African Pompano - 24" FL - 2 / day

Red Snapper - 20" TL - 2 / Day - FLORIDA WATERS

ONLY (Within 3 Miles of shore!)

Snappers - 10 / day aggregate

Mangrove - 10"

Lane - 8"

Mutton - 16"

Cubera - 12'

May possess no more than 2 Cubera Snapper over 30' per harvester or vessel per day, whichever is less. 30" or larger not included within the Snapper aggregate bag limit.

Check the Regs before each trip to make sure they haven't changed!
